## Final straight for the celebration of Cantons of A Coruña

After the 2020 stoppage due to the effects of COVID-19, the Cantonese Grand Prix of A Coruña returns again, on a renewed asphalt, on June 5, the most important event on the world calendar before the Tokyo Olympic Games .

This is demonstrated by the annual ranking prepared by the World Athletics itself in the last edition held (2019), led by the A Coruña event ahead, among others, of the powerful China Championship, the Asian Championship and even the European Cu itself from that year.

## Many medalists from the last European Cup will be in A Coruña

After the conclusion of the European Team Walking Championship, held in the Czech town of Podebrady, with excellent results for the Spanish delegation, the confirmations to participate in the Cantonese Grand Prix of A Coruña continue. In the men's category, the maximum number foreseen by the organization (80) has already been reached, practically twice as many participants as those who finished in Podebrady (44).

The test of the 20 km men will be a real luxury since there will be the full podium of the recent European Marching Championship. The gold medalist, the Swede Perseus Karlstrom, who stopped the clock at 1h18:54, is already registered in order to carry out his last great quality test prior to the Olympic Games that make him a serious candidate for the title. On the Spanish side, the two medalists who achieved the silver and bronze "double" in the same distance have already confirmed: Álvaro Martín and Diego García. With these positions, both the Extremaduran and Madrid walker contributed decisively for Spain to achieve the title of European distance champion.

Another very prominent presence will be that of the European team champion in the 50 km, the Spanish Marc Tur (3h47:40), who will also be in Cantones providing prestige and international quality.

On the female side and in conjunction with the European representatives, we will have on the asphalt of Coruña the bronze medalist of the European event in the 35 km, the Italian Lidia Barcella (2h51:50). Also with Spanish Laura García Caro who would get bronze in the 20 km. (1h28:07). Similarly, the fourth classified have already been confirmed: Raquel González (20 km) and María Juárez (35 km).

Other finalists are also registered in Podebrady, such as the Italian Federica Curiazzy and the German Karl Junghanns.

## **Outstanding Galician presence**

Galician athletics will also be represented in Cantones with the participation of the Antía brothers and Daniel Chamosa. The first one took part with the Spanish team this weekend in the European Cup, achieving over 35 km. a very prominent eleventh place. The record achieved by the Galician of 2h.57: 51 represents in the same way a new record of Spain Sub23 that make it a clear reference of the women's march over this distance.

His brother, Daniel Chamosa, after a period of hiatus forced by an injury, returned to the competition recently, proclaiming himself the Galician champion of 20 km in A Pobra do Caramiñal a few dates ago, also showing his excellent category.
